(Hy)	PITCH Accuracy, clarity and definition of notes and/or intonation	 Sing, then play the D major scale and arpeggio, one octave. Make up mini tunes in the key using 'call and response' and then improvisation. Spot which bars use the scale or arpeggio patterns. Say the note names in rhythm, then also pitches/solfège and fingerings. Transpose the melody up or down one string - what effect does it have?
	TIME Suitability of tempo, stability of pulse, sense of rhythm	 Clap the pulse while listening to the piece on a CD or online. Where are the strong beats? How many beats in a bar? Can simple steps be danced? Clap the rhythm of the first 2 bars, making up words. Try playing the rhythms and bowings on one open string, then with string crossings. Is it easier and more flowing to use full bows or small bows in the middle? For fun, play the quaver bars with dotted rhythms to create ease in the string crossings.
	TONE Control and projection of the sound, sensitivity and awareness in use of tonal qualities	 Try using smooth bows on the quavers to create flow. Can the two crotchet 'up-bows' be lifted off the string? What effect does it have? To aid ensemble, omit the two 'up bow' crotchets in bars 2, 4 & 8 and listen to the piano tune instead. How quiet can the crotchets be? Best with tiny bows or lifted off the string? Try making a crescendo during the quavers - what happens with the bow division? Does the music flow better?
	SHAPE Effectiveness and clarity of musical shaping and detailing	 Play the rhythms exaggerating the shaping with the bow but without left-hand fingers. How many phrases are there – are any repeated? What happens if they are all played the same? What happens if the dynamics are reversed? What happens if the bowing is reversed?
	PERFORMANCE Overall command, involvement with the music, musical communication	 Watch a Minuet being danced on YouTube - what speed is it? Does the tempo relate to the large, heavy dresses? Add breath marks and check if the piano can be heard when it has the tune. What mood do you want to communicate to the audience? How can the piece sound poised? How can the end sound gentle? Exaggerate the dynamics - can all the friends at the back of the room hear them? Listen to a Haydn string quartet, Minuet movement.
